Even in Grade 5, more students access the internet through a tablet or laptop than though a desktop



24% of students in grade 4, 52% of students in Grade 7 and 85% percent of students in Grade 11 have their own phone Close to half (49%) of students in Grade 4 have access to their own phone or someone else's phone on a regular basis



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
